

2. SHARED URBAN AGRICULTURE GARDEN IN THE HEART OF FORT-DE-FRANCE (MARTINIQUE)

The shared garden was created by the local association Ypiranga de Pastinha, one of whose projects aims to establish small participatory gardens in the heart of the Terres SainVilles neighborhood in Fort-de-France.

The objective of these gardens is to make the values of participatory gardening accessible to as many people as possible. These gardens become a real social space, where the mix of ages and knowledge allow everyone to cultivate their own garden.

The people of the Terres Sainville neighborhood can also harvest the fruits and vegetables produced, and thus benefit from fresh produce grown at the foot of their buildings.

In addition, these gardens, created with the city of Fort-de-France, become real green lungs in the middle of the city, which also helps to reduce the rate of air pollution in a city where the rate of fine particles regularly exceeds the threshold in force. Five more gardens are planned for 2022.



One of the walls of the garden has been decorated with a mural. This mural is intended to alert people to the production of waste, particularly plastic waste, which often ends up in the seas and oceans. The tail of the whale, represented by a garbage bag, is an allegory of the "emerging part of the iceberg".
